- 3. Theme: For this contest:
 - Family Vacation
- 4. Submission: Participants shall submit their MOC at the Red Mountain Bricks' store on or before the posted submission date. Winning submissions are displayed at the Red Mountain Bricks' store for two weeks following the contest conclusion.
- 5. Deadline: All submissions must be received by February 21, 2025.

 - Building Technique

Age-Specific Rules:

Ages 5-10:

- Size Limit: Creations must fit within a 16×16 stud baseplate.
- Assistance: Parents or guardians may offer help with building but shall not construct the MOC themselves.
- Safety: Ensure small parts are properly attached to prevent a choking hazard.

Ages 11-16:

- Size Limit: Creations must fit within a 32×32 stud base plate.
- Complexity: Encourage more complex building techniques like SNOT (Studs Not On Top).
- Innovation: Points for innovative use of pieces, especially repurposing parts for different uses.

16 and Up:

- Size Limit: Creations must fit within a 32×32 stud base plate.
- Advanced Techniques: More points for advanced building techniques, structural integrity, and aesthetic details.
- Complexity: Encourage more complex building techniques like SNOT (Studs Not On Top).
- Innovation: Points for innovative use of pieces, especially repurposing parts for different uses.

Additional Rules:

- Voting: Submissions shall be displayed during store hours for public voting. Public voting shall include one vote per age group. Ballots shall be provided for anyone wanting to vote. Red Mountain Bricks staff will vote to break any ties.
- Prizes:
 - People's choice award for most votes over all

Theme Overview:

Suggestions:

1. Visit to Grandma's House

Concept: A nostalgic family trip to Grandma's cozy home.

Details: Build a quaint house with a pitched roof, flower boxes, and a front porch with a rocking chair. Inside, include a kitchen with a minifig Grandma baking cookies, a family playing board games, or napping on a couch. Add a garden with a swing set or a vegetable patch.

Vacation Style Twist: Show the family arriving in a packed car with suitcases strapped to the roof, capturing the road trip vibe.

2. Sleepover at a Friend's House

Concept: A fun, low-key "vacation" spent at a best friend's place.

Details: Create a bedroom scene with sleeping bags, a TV with minifigs playing video games, and a pizza box. Add a backyard with a treehouse or a trampoline for extra playfulness.

Scale and Focus: A smaller, detailed build can stand out as much as a big one—focus on storytelling over size.

Motion: Suggest movement (e.g., a car mid-drive, a plane landing, or a hiker mid-step) to bring the scene to life.

Mood: Use warm colors and cheerful minifig expressions to convey the joy of a family vacation.

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
